Preamble for the Initiate

Dear Candidate for Initiation, you are about to depart the profane, material world and enter another region where time and eternity, God and humans meet. You have therefore been deprived of the trappings and chattels of all that is mundane and your vulnerability and common humanity are exposed. Stripped of familiar associations, you will soon experience the ritual of separation from a former life. You are about to commence a journey towards wholeness where life is performed without a mask. To facilitate the passage, you will, initially, be blindfold in order that you may begin to look inwards at the deepest level of yourself.

During the journey you will not be humiliated but you will be made to feel humble; you will not be demeaned but the living merits of truth, honour and virtue will be exemplified; you will not be harmed but your human frailty and innocence will be demonstrated; your human dignity will not be degraded but your true identity will be challenged.

In the Lodge beyond this door, across the threshold, you will become aware, through shared experience, that you are part of an indivisible whole. Please now contemplate quietly for a few moments, clear your mind of all that has gone before and open your heart and soul ready to be moved by a ritual whose significance and wisdom transcend the passage of time and prepare to experience a transformation that all Initiates into Freemasonry have undergone from time immemorial.

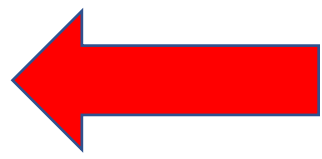

Welcome to "Starting your Journey in Freemasonry". This module has guest access which means anybody can view it. The module "Getting started on Solomon" is also guest access. In order to gain access to the system you need to:

1. Register an account
2. Enrol on relevant modules.

This is "Starting your Journey in Freemasonry"

When you do enrol, be sure to scroll past down to the bottom of the screen and press the 'Enrol' key. It is a bit hidden at the bottom of the screen, and we are working to make this more obvious. The system is open to everyone and you can access any module. However, we recommend that you do not look at anything relating to the First Degree, Second Degree, Third Degree or Royal Arch until after you have experienced your ceremony. Otherwise it will ruin the impact, a little bit like a "plot spoiler".

Freemasonry is one of the world's oldest social and charitable organisations. Its roots lie in the traditions of the medieval stonemasons who built our cathedrals and castles. For Freemasons, there are four important values that help define their path through life: Integrity, Friendship, Respect and Charity. In today's world filled with uncertainty, these principles ring as true as they have at any point in the organisation's history.

Answer:

Global Search (of all the Modules you are enrolled on) is available as a box at the top of every page. Searches can use Boolean expressions such as AND OR NOT. If you are using a mobile device you need to go into the Dashboard, which is available at the top left with the three parallel lines symbol for the Menu.

Search is actually very sophisticated. It allows for wildcard, proximity and boosted search.

So for example:

1. "Gloves" will give you three pages of results.
2. "Gloves AND clothing" will do an ANDed search that returns only results that mentions both search terms.
3. "Gloves OR clothing" returns all the terms with Gloves OR clothing; quite a few. This is the same as using "Gloves clothing" as the search term.
4. "Gloves NOT clothing" will return those files that contain the word Gloves but not clothing.

Do not enter the " symbol for your search.

The search can be further limited by using the drop down "Filter" where you can select that only Titles, Files or a specific Module can be selected.

Global Search will only return results back for which you have been enrolled so there is no chance of a "plot spoiler".

You can improve your search using any of the following search query features:

1. Specifying the field to be searched by prefixing the search query with 'title:', 'content:', 'name:', or 'intro:' e.g. 'title:news' returns results with the word 'news' in the title
2. Boolean operators ('AND', 'OR', 'NOT') to combine or exclude keywords
3. **Wildcard** characters ('*' or '?') to represent characters in the search query
4. **Proximity** searches ('~') e.g. mood~2 returns "moodle" (2 letters away from "mood"), Moodle Australia~3 returns results containing "Moodle HQ in Perth, Australia" (the queried terms were within 3 words of each other)
5. **Boosting terms** ('^') to boost certain words or phrases e.g. "Perth Australia"^5 "Australia" will return results with the phrase "Perth Australia" as more relevant.

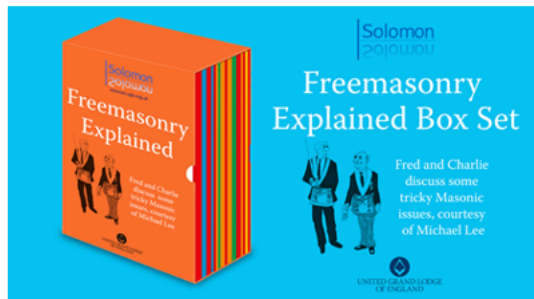
